The WHO guidance supports the use of straight needles, for routine collections on adult populations.

The guidance supports the use of wingsets with:

- patients with difficult to access, small veins in paediatric patients, the elderly, and other at-risk populations.
- blood culture collections
- patients who are immobile and cannot physically change the position of their arms or those patients where a large number of tubes are to be collected at one time.

European Federation of Clinical Chemistry and Laboratory Medicine (EFLM) recommendations for venous blood sampling

- The recommendations describe the blood collection process and offer guidance on ensuring that blood collection is a safe and patient-centred procedure.
- The EFLM guidance states that, "Needle, holder and the blood tube make together an
 integral blood collection system. Only individual components of the same manufacturer
 should be used as a part of the blood collection system. Whereas manufacturers ensure
 the full compatibility between the components of their system, individual components
 from different manufacturers should never be used together, as their combinations are
 not validated for the intended use and may compromise patient and healthcare worker
 safety".
